Bluestem Foundation fundraiser for staff continuing education at JPMC.

One of the longest-running charitable events in Bartlesville will again be held next month as the Bluestem Regional Medical Development Foundation hosts its 19th annual fundraising dinner. JPMC Earns Two More Heart Awards

Jane Phillips Medical Center has again been recognized by the American Heart Association and included in *U.S. News & World Report's* Best Hospitals edition. JPMC earned the AHA's Mission: Lifeline Bronze Performance Achievement Award and the Silver Achievement Award for outstanding care of coronary heart disease (CAD) and heart failure (HF). The honors highlight JPMC's commitment and success in implementing a higher standard of care for certain heart attack patients. Since the AHA began tracking heart patient data in 2007, JPMC has routinely earned awards for outstanding cardiology care.

"This tremendous achievement was a team effort," said Stan DeFehr, MD, BlueStem Cardiology. "The cardiologists, the cath lab staff, and all of the nurses in our cardiology unit can take great pride in this."

The Silver Award recognizes JPMC for 85% or higher adherence to certain measures over 12 consecutive months. JPMC is one of only three Oklahoma hospitals to earn a Silver Award and the only hospital to receive it for both CAD and HF. It is the second year in a row JPMC has won the award.

This is the first year for the AHA's Mission: Lifeline awards because they are solely based on data from 2009. As such, there are only two awards – Silver and Bronze. JPMC came extremely close to earning a Silver award. A Gold award will be added with the collection of additional data.

JPMC is one of only 72 hospitals across the country and one of only two in Oklahoma to earn a Bronze Award.

The award is based on JPMC effectively improving the survival and care of STEMI patients. Heart attacks are divided into two groups, based on severity. A STEMI is the

more severe type.

This is a new standard that JPMC is tracking and differs from data on which prior awards have been based. This particular award is for treating patients that come from hospitals that cannot perform intervention. These would include regional hospitals such as those in Nowata, Pawhuska, Coffeyville, and Independence. The time is tracked from when they leave those facilities until JPMC performs the intervention.

Every year, almost 400,000 people experience the STEMI type of heart attack.

Unfortunately, a significant number do not receive prompt reperfusion (tissue damage) therapy, which is critical in restoring blood flow. Mission: Lifeline seeks to save lives by closing the gaps that separate STEMI patients from timely access to appropriate treatments.

It is focused on improving the system of care for these patients and at the same time improving care for all heart attack patients.

Hospitals that receive the Mission: Lifeline Bronze Performance Achievement Award have demonstrated for three consecutive months that at least 85 percent of eligible STEMI patients are treated within specific time frames upon entering the hospital and discharged following the AHA's recommended treatment guidelines.


In 2009, JPMC cared for 65 STEMI patients.

"We are proud to be recognized for our dedication and achievements in cardiac care," said David R. Stire, President/CEO. "At Jane Phillips

Medical Center it is all about the combined efforts of technology, top-notch physicians and a team environment. Having all of these assets available here in Bartlesville is something of which we all can be proud."

Stire said the number of acute heart attack patients eligible for treatment is expected to grow over the next decade due to increasing incidence of heart disease and a large aging population.

"JPMC remains dedicated to delivering quality heart care close to home," Stire said.

The hospital recently announced plans to build a new \$4 million cardiology building. Construction is expected to begin next month. 





JPMC To Build New Cardiology Building

Jane Phillips Medical Center will soon break ground for the construction of a new \$4 million cardiology building. The 16,000 square foot facility will house medical offices and cardiology services with the majority of space being rented to BlueStem Cardiology. Construction is expected to begin in September with a completion target date of July 2011.


Designed to incorporate as much natural light as possible, the new facility will be located south of the Cancer Center and will feature two levels with 19 exam rooms and 50 parking spaces.

"We are very excited about this new addition to our campus," said President/CEO David R. Stire. "The building will provide much-needed space for the cardiologists and the patients they serve."

BlueStem Cardiology physicians and staff are on the fifth floor of Medical Park Center as well as half the sixth floor. Current office space totals 9,700 square feet.

The new facility is designed for future cardiology services growth. Four additional exam rooms and office space for a fifth cardiologist can be added later to support the increase of patients.

BlueStem Cardiology is comprised of Dr. Stan DeFehr, Dr. Pat Tinker, Dr. Gary Dykstra, and Dr. Anderson Mehrle.

In 2008, the American College of Cardiology ranked JPMC as the best hospital in the country for providing heart patients with critical medication upon discharge. Since that time JPMC and BlueStem Cardiology have consistently been recognized and honored by the ACC and American Heart Association for excellence in treating heart patients.

A BENEFIT TRAIL RIDE TO FIGHT DIABETES

Jane Phillips Medical Center and the Bluestem Foundation are hosting a benefit trail ride to fight diabetes on Saturday, October 16 at 9:30 a.m. at Cedar Creek Ranch.

For people who have diabetes, education and support from a team of health care professionals can help them maintain control of their diabetes and assist them in living a long and healthy life. JPMC offers an outpatient education and support program that is certified by the American Diabetes Association. However, only eight percent of people who are discharged from the hospital with diabetes attend diabetic education classes.


The ride will be on the Cedar Creek Ranch, one of the ranches

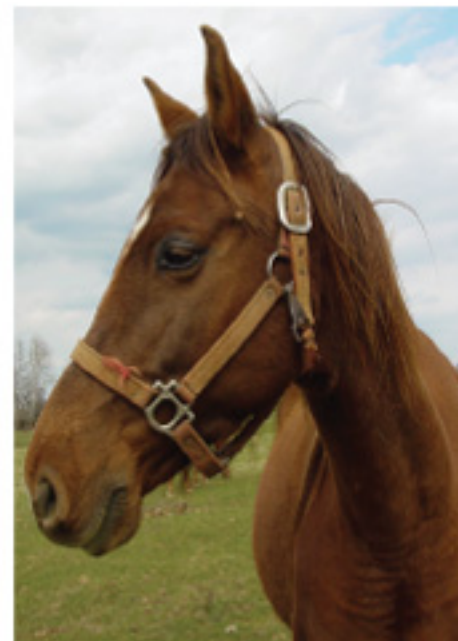
owned and operated by John F. and John B. Kane. The ranch has been part of the Kane family operation since 1966 and is situated in eastern Osage County. Deep canyons, thick stands of blackjack oak trees, and native bluestem rangeland, mark the ranch. Cedar Creek and Buck Creek run through the ranch, along with a scenic natural horseshoe lake.

The ride will be at a new location this year. To get to the trail ride from Bartlesville, drive 12 miles west on US Highway 60. Turn north (right) onto CR 3060, drive one mile, then

turn north (right) onto CR 3775. Drive approximately 1.5 miles. Saddle Up for Diabetes will meet on the west (left) side of the road.

Cost for those participating in the trail ride is \$45 per person. This includes the ride and lunch. Riders are to supply their own horses.

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JPMC VP Appointed by Senate

A vice president at Jane Phillips Medical Center has been appointed by the Oklahoma Senate to a panel charged with overseeing federal money for healthcare technology. Sam Guild, Vice President of Clinical Operations at JPMC, was appointed by Senate Pro Tem Glenn Coffee to the Oklahoma Health Information Exchange Trust. Guild will serve a two-year term.

"I am honored and excited to receive this appointment," Guild said. "I look forward to working with the other members of the panel to ensure our federal dollars are wisely spent."

The seven-member trust will supervise some \$12 million for healthcare-related information technology. It will administer grants for the purposes of facilitating and expanding electronic use of health information among healthcare providers. These grants are designed to assist designated areas in developing Health Information Data Exchanges that will allow Emergency Departments and other providers to access a patient's health record so they know the patient's medical history. The Tulsa area received a grant for this purpose.



Guild has been a CEO and CFO in his 20-plus years in the healthcare industry. In addition, he has an MBA and a Master's degree in accounting, both from Oklahoma City University.
